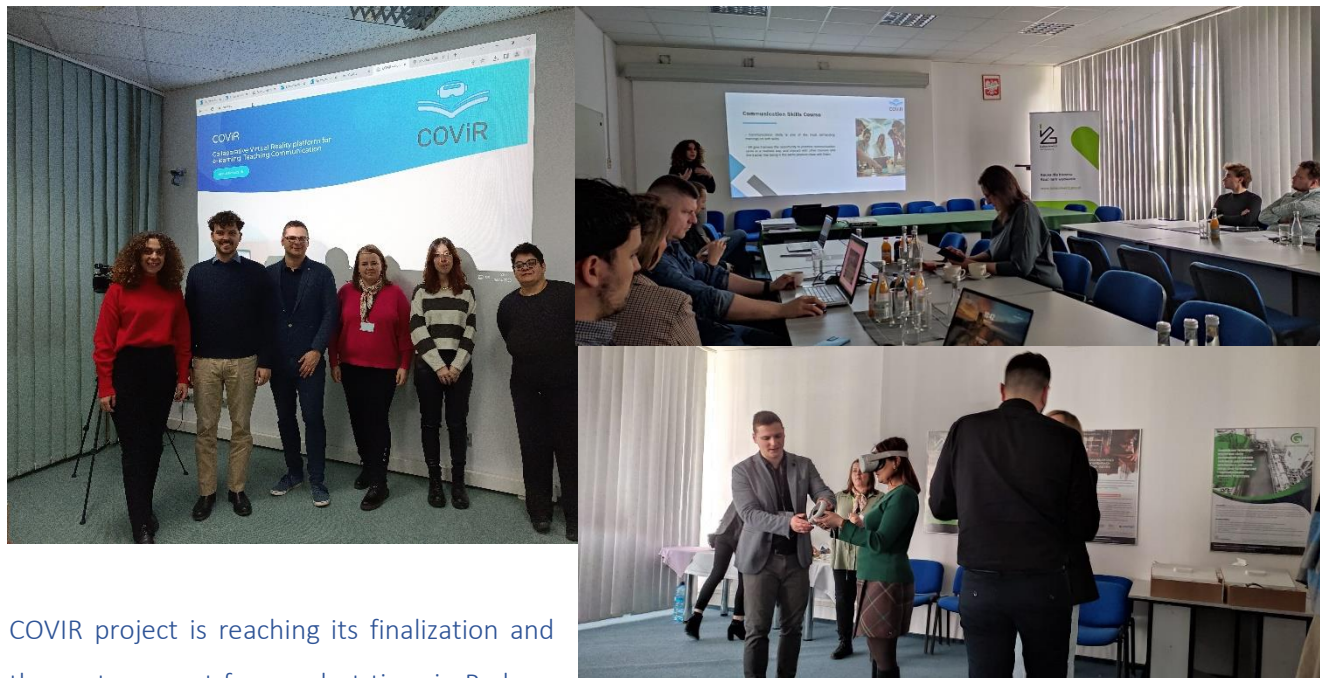


**NAME:** COViR - Collaborative Virtual Reality platform for e-learning: Teaching Communication

## PRESS RELEASE



COViR project is reaching its finalization and the partners met for one last time in Radom,

Poland, between the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> of April 2023. COViR is an Erasmus+ project, funded under the call for proposals KA2 -Cooperation for innovation and the exchange of good practices in the field of “Partnerships for Digital Education Readiness”. The project is coordinated by Lukaszewicz-National Agency (Poland) and the partners are: MMC Management Center Ltd (Cyprus), EDITC (Cyprus), Kypriaki Etaireia Pistopiisis (Cyprus), Fundacion Equipo Humano (Spain) and Senseworks (Greece).

ITEE, the project’s coordinator, has hosted the meeting in their premises. During the final meeting, partners discussed various aspects of the project, including the development of the VR collaborative platform, content authoring tools for the VR platform, communication skill course curriculum, and evaluation of the VR platform and tools. The meeting also included discussions on strengthening teachers’ competences in the use of VR tools for training, and the CoViR certification scheme and assessment tools.



During the second day of the partners' stay in Radom, the final conference took place at the coordinator's premises too. The final conference comprised of presentations on the COViR e-learning course and rules of certification, the Communication skills course, the COViR Teacher's Guide, and the COViR platform in the VR environment. MMC Mediterranean Management Centre, presented the COVR Communication skills course, as the respective activity leader. The day concluded with practical training in VR led by experts, in which they were able to interact in first person with the developed tools.

While COViR project is finishing, the tools and materials developed within its framework, remain available to any person interested in using them!
